



What is Key Leader Weekend?

It is an opportunity for high school students, ages 14-18, to obtain leadership skills by participating in hands on experiences which help them understand what it means to hold onto your values. The program was created by Kiwanis International and is designed to help students consider possible real life situations which can help them acquire self-confidence and leadership skills.

The students come away from this weekend with a greater understanding of personal values and with a positive outlook on life. They make friends for a lifetime. They learn to connect with other students from all types of different backgrounds, and they learn what it means to be a team player. They learn that in order to be a leader, you must put others first, and that you must work together to successfully complete any project.

Where does your money go?

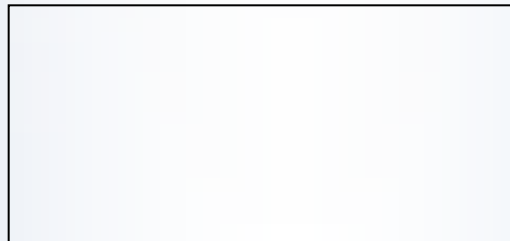
